THIS ORDER IS ISSUED SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING RESTRICTIONS AND CONDITIONS


1. Approval is hereby granted as provided in Article 6 of Regulation I of the Puget Sound Clean Air Agency to the applicant to install or establish the equipment, device or process described hereon at the INSTALLATION ADDRESS in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the Engineering Division of the Puget Sound Clean Air Agency.
2. This approval does not relieve the applicant or owner of any requirement of any other governmental agency.
3. All emissions from the remediation system shall be vented through the two-stage carbon adsorbers except as specified in Condition No. 5. Franz Seattle Div of U S Baking (Gai's Northwest Bakery) shall perform monthly monitoring of the concentration of total petroleum hydrocarbons at the inlet and outlet of the first carbon adsorber in the series.
4. The concentration of total petroleum hydrocarbons in the exhaust of the first carbon adsorber in the series shall not exceed 50 ppm.
5. If the most recent monitoring shows that the concentration of total petroleum hydrocarbons at the inlet to the first carbon adsorber is below 50 ppm for a period greater than 30 consecutive days, the carbon adsorbers may be removed provided that the uncontrolled emissions of total petroleum hydrocarbons are monitored monthly to assure that the concentration remains below 50 ppm. The Puget Sound Clean Air Agency shall be notified, in writing, 7 days prior to removing the carbon adsorbers and within 7 days of measuring an uncontrolled total petroleum hydrocarbon concentration at or above 50 ppm (after carbon adsorbers have been removed).
6. Monitoring and inspection records shall be maintained on-site to demonstrate compliance with the conditions of this Order and to demonstrate the system and carbon adsorbers are maintained in good working order. These records shall be made available to Puget Sound Clean Air Agency personnel upon request.
7. Operation of the soil vapor extraction system shall not be allowed for a period longer than three years.


APPEAL RIGHTS


Pursuant to Puget Sound Clean Air Agency's Regulation I, Section 3.17 and RCW 43.21B.310, this Order may be
